



Dr. Michael Lau is a renowned herpetologist and conservationist in Hong Kong. He conducted his Ph.D. research on the ecology of Hong Kong amphibians and the conservation of the endemic Romer's Tree Frog. During his time with HKU, he also took part in the Hong Kong Biodiversity Survey. His work experience includes leading the South China forest conservation programme in Kadoorie Farm and Botanic Garden as well as wetlands and local biodiversity conservation in WWF-Hong Kong. He is now a free-lance consultant and is an adjunct professor in the School of Biological Sciences, HKU.

He played an active role in formulating the Hong Kong Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan and sat in the Steering Committee. He is a member of three Specialist Groups (on amphibians and reptiles) of the IUCN Species Survival Commission (SSC) and helps conduct assessments for the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species. He is also a founding member of the Hong Kong Wetlands Conservation Association.

His rich experience in field conservation projects and ecological study throughout his career has made him an ideal person in teaching Local Ecology.

劉惠寧博士是香港著名的兩棲爬行學家和生態保育學者，他的博士研究是關於香港兩棲動物生態及盧氏小樹蛙的保育。他在香港大學時還參與了香港生物多樣性調查。他的工作經驗包括領導嘉道理農場暨植物園的華南森林保育計劃，以及世界自然基金會香港分會的濕地和本地生物多樣性保育，現為自由顧問及香港大學生物科學學院客席教授。

他積極參與制訂香港生物多樣性策略和行動計劃，並擔任督導委員會成員。他是 IUCN 物種生存委員會三個專家組的成員，並幫助對受威脅物種進行紅色名錄評估。他亦是香港濕地保育協會的創會會員。

他在野外保育和生態研究方面的豐富經驗使他成為教授本地生態學的理想人選。
